Drums: Bob Johnson

Bob Johnson has been performing and teaching in the Boston area for over fifty years. Throughout the 1970s and 1980s he played in the orchestra for a great many local community theatrical productions, youth theater groups, church and civic organization performances. He taught drums, piano, and handbells at the Charles River Creative Arts program, as well as playing in the orchestra for their musical productions, from 1972 to 2019. He also played for New England Band Productions, a marching band that performs throughout the New England area, from 1993 to 2021. Over the last thirty-five years, Bob has focused more on teaching, extending his instruction to additional local music studios. He entered students in a New England Music Competition sponsored by one of these studios from 1991 to 2016, with many students winning first, second and third place in their categories. One of these students placed first in a state championship category, while two other students placed second in their state final competition.

Guitar and Bass: Russell Chudnofsky

Russell has been teaching guitar and bass for 2 decades in a variety of settings, to all levels of students. He teaches a wide variety of styles, including rock, pop, country, fingerstyle, blues, R&B, slide guitar, folk, and jazz. Russell has recorded and toured the world playing guitar for a number of internationally acclaimed artists. This includes Grammy Award winning songwriter Lori McKenna, Grammy nominated singer Tanya Donelly, Tim Gearan, Sarah Borges, and Amelia White, among many others. He has toured as an opening act for Frank Black of the Pixies, Faith Hill and Tim McGraw, Trisha Yearwood, Throwing Muses, Laura Veirs, and has opened for Gillian Welch, Hot Tuna, Steve Earle, Gary Clark Jr. and John Fogerty of Creedence Clearwater Revival. Russell played guitar for Lori McKenna on the Faith Hill/Tim McGraw Soul to Soul II tour, the largest country music tour in history at the time. He has also appeared at The Grand Ole Opry, Lincoln Center in New York City, and on Good Morning America with McKenna.

Piano (1): Yu Ya Huang

Yu Ya has her master's degree in piano performance and music education from The Boston Conservatory. As a performer, she has given recitals in Boston, Mass.; California; and Taiwan. As an accompanist, Miss Huang has performed with instrumentalists, choral groups, theater productions, and dance companies. She is also a very experienced early-childhood educator. Currently, she teaches piano at schools in the Greater Boston area, and performs salon music from time to time. Yu Ya is very interested in working with the students who like to share the wonderful experience in the Performing Arts area. She hopes her knowledge and experience will offer the students with a high level of standards that will produce very prepared, marketable and talented artists.

Piano (2): Alexandre Rezende Santos
